Let's update the Union of Kansai Governments to version 2.0!!

Since its establishment in December 2010 as Japan's first and only pan-prefectural association, the Union of Kansai Governments has promoted region-wide administration, planning, and policy coordination in seven areas: disaster prevention; tourism, culture and sports promotion; industrial promotion; healthcare; environmental conservation; certification exams and licensing; and staff training. However, as we celebrate our thirteenth year of establishment, there have been significant changes around us.

While embracing the underlying idea of "Kansai is one, looking after each area of Kansai," we will take measures against COVID-19 and avian flu, and prioritize the safety and security of the citizens of the prefectures using our experience of the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake. Thus, we aim to achieve the following three goals to upgrade the Union of Kansai Governments further:

The first is to become a "Kansai that takes charge." In March 2023, the Agency for Cultural Affairs relocated to Kyoto and began operations. Kansai is the only region in

Japan that has achieved the relocation of a central government agency to a regional location since the Meiji period (1868-1912). Based on this achievement, we will continue to attain results as Kansai plays a role in building a decentralized society and a Japan with a bilateral structure.

The second is to become a "dynamic Kansai." Two major global events will be held in Kansai: Expo 2025 Osaka Kansai in two years, and the World Masters Games 2027 Kansai two years after that. Leveraging them as opportunities to attract the world's attention, we would like to work with the business community and various organizations to revitalize the Kansai region and send a message to the world.

The third is to create a "connected Kansai." Throughout history, Kansai has thrived due to its connections through water, roads, and culture. Let us create a Kansai that values and promotes such connections from the present to the future.

We hope to join our hearts and forces with all of you to progress toward a sustainable future for the Kansai region. We look forward to your continued guidance and support.

Let's give it our all, together!

The UKG's Vision for the Future of Kansai

The Fifth Comprehensive UKG Plan of the Union of Kansai Governments (planning period: FY2023 - FY2025) sets forth the following three basic concepts for Kansai's future and aims to realize them by making the Union of Kansai Governments the hub for integrating Kansai's strengths.

(1) Kansai creating a bilateral structure in Japan and promoting a decentralization reform

- ·Aim to break down the centralized administrative framework, have Kansai drive Japan's economic growth, and redress Tokyo's dominant role in the nation's life.
- •Persistently seek the transfer of national government agencies, and proactively seek the transfer of national government affairs and authority necessary for the development of Kansai.
- •Work with the business community to create a backup structure for capital city functions, and promote initiatives to address the disparity in infrastructure between the Tokyo metropolitan area and the rest of Japan.

(2) Kansai thriving as a region by promoting digitalization and taking advantage of its individuality, strengths, history, and culture

- ·Seize the momentum of society's increasing digitalization and harness it for Kansai's overall development.
- •Promote the charms of each Kansai locality, both in Japan and abroad, utilizing its deep unparalleled history, culture, and arts.
- •Increase the number of people who are proud of, attached to, and believe in Kansai, and create a Kansai that flourishes as a region.

(3) Kansai, a new value creation hub connected with Asia and the world

- •Proactively undertake initiatives from a global perspective in each area, both in structural and non-structural aspects.
- ·Leverage global events to attract people, goods, and information to Kansai, have it create new value, and enhance its global presence.

The Commission

: When the president of the UKG makes decisions about its policies, the Commission of the UKG coordinates with and communicates those decisions to the UKG members. Member governors and mayors who have been appointed commissioners of the UKG divisions then take responsibility for each project. The Commission shares responsibilities in making decisions and providing services.


: As a legislative body, the Assembly has an authority that is equivalent to that of local government assemblies, including revision and repeal of ordinances and budget resolution. It is composed of 39 members selected from member prefectural and city assemblies.

: The Council hears a wide range of opinions from residents and discusses issues faced by the region of Kansai. It also discusses the UKG's vision for the future.

: Headquarters are set up to conduct official business such as general coordination and planning, decentralization policy, and work related to certification examinations and licenses. In addition, branch offices located in prefectures conduct office work in areas for which they are responsible. Staff from prefectural or city government offices works at these offices. Finally, a UKG Assembly bureau supports the Assembly's activities.

Realizing a decentralized society

~ Initiatives to create a bilateral structure in Japan and promote a decentralization reform~

For the growth of the Kansai region, we will promote regional development and demonstrate that Kansai is a suitable region to support capital city functions, thereby promoting further relocation of government agencies, and creating a bilateral structure in Japan. Also, by building the achievements of a Kansai-wide administration, we will demonstrate our ability to take over the affairs and authority of the national government, which will lead to the delegation of the national government's duties that are appropriate for the Union. By promoting these initiatives comprehensively, we aim to realize a Kansai rich in individuality and vitality, leading a decentralized society in which the communities themselves can determine their policy priorities.

■ Building a backup structure for capital functions

In case of an emergency in the capital, it's essential to have a backup base that can support its political, administrative, and economic functions. We believe Kansai is an ideal location for this because of its high concentration of national agencies and corporate headquarters, excellent transportation and communication capabilities, and the ongoing support and cooperation of the public and private sectors, including the UKG.

■ Relocation of government agencies

To expand the effectiveness and innovativeness of policies of government agencies established in Kansai, such as the Agency for Cultural Affairs, the Consumer Affairs Agency's Headquarters for New Future Creation Strategies, and the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communication's Statistical Data Utilization Center, we will promote partnership and cooperation, including with affiliated bodies and the business community to further relocate government agencies and central government regional offices to the region.

■ Creating a Disaster Management Agency

We will continue to promote the creation of a Kansai-based Disaster Management Agency, a bilateral organization with expertise in a series of disaster countermeasures, including investigative studies and scenarios of disaster prevention measures based on past experience.

■ Transferring the national government's functions and authority

We will propose the decentralization of power to the national government in order to achieve a drastic expansion of the role of our "region-wide block-based union" and a transfer of authority. At the same time, we will seek the transfer of administrative duties and authority from the national government by building Kansai's region-wide administration achievements and demonstrating its ability to take over national administrative affairs and power.

Cooperation with various entities

- O To realize the "Union of Kansai Governments' Vision for the Future of Kansai," we will work with the business community, partner organizations (Fukui and Mie Prefectures), the national government, municipalities, and various other entities to become a hub for unifying Kansai's authority and revitalizing the entire Kansai region.
- We will actively communicate the merits of the UKG and information on regional affairs to residents, and emphasize its presence to improve the public's understanding. We will also reflect residents' opinions on our policies through the Council of the Union of Kansai Governments, which consists of representatives of regional organizations, academic experts, and publicly recruited committee members, and through periodic opinion exchange meetings with municipalities.

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The UKG is Japan's first extended inter-prefectural association, comprising eight prefectures (two Fu and six Ken) and four cities. The area has a population of 22 million, making the UKG the largest local public organization in Japan.

What is an extended inter-prefectural association?

It is a special local public entity with assemblies and administrative committees as stipulated in Article 284 of the Local Autonomy Act. It can flexibly and comprehensively deal with region-wide administrative needs that extend beyond the bounds of prefectures. An inter-prefectural association can be assigned the national government's functions and authority under laws and regulations.



To mark the fifth anniversary of establishment and official membership of Nara Prefecture, the UKG has chosen a new logo from ideas submitted by the public. Using the letter K for Kansai as a motif, it represents the UKG's gathering of forces and its strive for making Kansai full of character and power.

World Masters Games 2027 Kansai

The World Masters Games are an international multi-sport athletic competition for athletes over the age of 30 and into their middle age and senior years. The World Masters Games Kansai will be held across the Kansai region, with 35 sports and 59 events. It was postponed due to the COVID-19, and now the new session has been decided.

The new session:
